



OPPORTUNITY FOR TRAINING IN FARM MANAGEMENT

From traditional methods to use of modern technologies in cultivating crops and managing livestock makes farming a multifaceted activity. The use of technologies has changed approaches for agricultural and land usage practices from traditional to modern. Farmers or farm managers need a firm grasp of modern farming practices to succeed and support Malawi Government attain its aspiration as espoused in the Malawi 2063. As Malawi pursues various initiatives towards realisation of Agriculture Mechanization and Commercialisation and the MEGA farms, a need has been identified. Malawi needs Farm Managers and Farmers who have hands-on skills to make agriculture commercially viable for the country.

The TEVET Authority (TEVETA) in collaboration with the International Labour Organisation (ILO) is, therefore, pleased to invite interested stakeholders to participate in the implementation of the Farm Management Training programme in various Agri-TEVET programmes under the Informal Apprenticeship scheme. The programme provides a holistic understanding of farming and sustainable farming practices to help individuals, youth groups and cooperatives become well-grounded successful farmers and farm managers.

This is a three months' training programme aimed at supporting Government's agenda on agriculture commercialization and Mechanization. The initiative also responds to the job creation strategy, in keeping with the aspirations of Malawi 2063.

Programme Target Group

The programme targets individuals, youth groups and cooperatives with prior farming knowledge, experience and strong Interest in building a career in commercial agriculture. The individuals should possess a minimum qualification of a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) and be capable of finding own accommodation and access to training venues. Those with relevant Certificates, Diplomas and Degrees will have an added advantage.

Participating Farms

The participating Farms should be well established, accessible and able to provide practical training in their respective farm expertise. The farms should also be willing to have their staff trained in TEVET delivery.

Participating Off- takers

The participating off-takers should be well established in their business with specified standards of their products and duly registered with relevant Authorities.

Participating Training Institutions

The participating training institutions should be registered with the TEVET Authority and or other relevant Authorities in the specific Agri-TEVET programmes.

Program Focus Areas

The farm management programme shall be delivered with a primary objective of creating a pool of skilled and competent farm managers to fill the current gaps on farm management, specifically for the following Agriculture sub-sectors.

- 1. Agro-Processing
- 2. Aquaculture
- 3. Dairy farming
- 4. Goat Farming
- 5. Edible Horticulture (Fruits)
- 6. Edible Horticulture (Vegetables)
- 7. Maize Production
- 8. Piggery
- 9. Poultry Farming
- 10. Soya Beans Production

The programme will focus on' Leadership and supervision', and 'Entrepreneurship' competencies of the above stated Agri-TEVET sub-sectors.

Programme Delivery, Period, Duration and Application deadlines

The programmes will be delivered through a Work Integrated Learning (WIL) approach where 75 percent of learning is practical and done at the workplace or on the farm setting and 25 percent theory through classroom setting at a training institution and online. WIL approach requires the involvement and participation of farms, training institutions and where possible off takers of the produce from agricultural activities.

The programme is non-residential meaning that trainees will have to find own accommodation. The programme will be delivered using Competence Based Education and Training approach with theory provided through a combination of classroom and

online lectures and practical sessions done in the field. The Programme is expected to commence in September 2024 for the duration of three months.

Therefore, expression of interest should be submitted by Friday, the 23rd of August 2024 and application forms be submitted by Friday the 30th of August 2024 to the following addresses, by hand, postal or email.
